
## COVID-19 Vaccinations Starting from October 19





- ■COVID-19 vaccination for the '23-'24 season starts from October 19.
- ■Free COVID-19 vaccination is available to foreign residents regardless of health insurance status (\*Eligible to be given to undocumented residents if they have stayed in Korea for more than 90 days).
- ■COVID-19 vaccine (free) and influenza vaccine (at an extra cost) can be taken at the same time.
  - High-risk groups are advised to get both vaccines on the same visit to the doctor.
- ■Persons aged 12 to 64 who are not in high-risk groups and children & infants/toddlers in high-risk groups can also get the shots from November 1.



## 1. Vaccination strongly recommended to prevent severe illness & death in high-risk groups

- ■Recommended target group: High-risk groups such as people aged 65 or above, immunocompromised people aged 12 to 64, people who are hospitalized, admitted, or employed at high-risk settings.
- ■Vaccination period: Oct. 19, 2023 (Thursday) Mar. 31, 2024 (Sunday)
- ■Vaccination shot: XBB.1.5 vaccine (Pfizer, Moderna)
- ■Vaccination institutions: Consigned medical clinics/institutions & public health centers nationwide (15,000 locations)
- ■Vaccination fee: Free of charge (all citizens, including high-risk groups, registered foreign residents, and undocumented foreign residents who have stayed in Korea for more than 90 days)
- ■Vaccination method: Vaccination possible on the day with or without an appointment
  - \*Online appointment (ncvr.kdca.go.kr) & appointment by phone (1339 call center, local government call center & medical institutions)
  - \*Guardians (of spouse, child, etc.) can make a proxy appointment after confirming his/her legal relationship & required personal information.

## 2. COVID-19 vaccination for high-risk children & infants/toddlers begins on November 1, 2023

- ■Vaccination target group: High-risk children (5 to 11 years old) & infants/toddlers (6 months to 4 years old) who have not been vaccinated with the new XBB.1.5 vaccine
- ■Vaccination period: From November 1, 2023 (Wednesday)
- ■Vaccination shot: XBB.1.5 vaccine & Pfizer XBB.1.5 new vaccine for infants/toddlers
  - \*Children & infants/toddlers who have not been vaccinated with the Pfizer vaccine will be vaccinated with the Moderna vaccine.
  - \*Infants/toddlers who have already been vaccinated with Pfizer vaccines are eligible for the Pfizer vaccine.
- ■Vaccination institutions: Consigned medical clinics/institutions & public health centers nationwide (approximately 1,000 locations)
  - \*COVID-19 vaccination website (ncv.kdca.go.kr) > Vaccination status > COVID-19 vaccination providers (12 years of age or older, children & infants/toddlers)
- ■Vaccination fee: Free of charge (all citizens, including high-risk groups, registered foreign residents, and undocumented foreign residents who have stayed in Korea for more than 90 days)
